TOPIC D1: *The next EU CMDI framework: the views and expectations of EU authorities*

Professor Dr. Christos Gortsos

Christos Gortsos is Professor of Public Economic Law at the Law School of the National and Kapodistrian University of Athens (NKUA) and Visiting Professor at the Europa-Institut of the University of Saarland. The main fields of his research, publication and teaching activity include international and EU monetary and financial law, central banking law and institutional economics.

He studied, at undergraduate and graduate level, law, economics, finance, as well as international history and politics at the NKUA and the Universities of Zürich, Pennsylvania (Wharton Business School) and Geneva (Graduate Institute of International Studies, where he also obtained his PhD degree in international banking regulation).

Inter alia, he is currently:

- President of the Academic Board of the European Banking Institute (EBI);
- Vice-President of the Board of Appeal of the European Supervisory Authorities (ESAs);
- Member of the European Parliament's expert group on banking resolution;
- Research Partner in the University Research Priority Program "Financial Regulation" of the University of Zürich;
- Series Editor (with Professors D. Busch and A. Sciarone) of the "EBI Studies in Banking and Capital Markets Law" published by Palgrave Macmillan; as well as
- Member and Academic Coordinator of the Committee on International Monetary Law of the International Law Association (MOCOMILA).

During the winter semester of the academic year 2017-2018 he was a Bernard Braudel Senior Fellow at the Law Department of the European University Institute (EUI) in Florence and during the winter semester of the academic year 2018-2019 he was Academic Visitor at St Antony's College (Oxford University), affiliated to the Political Economy of Financial Markets Research Center. For the Academic Year 2022-2023 he has been invited as Visiting Scholar at the Faculty of Law of the University of Zürich.
